Pretreatment Instructions for Patient

•	Blood tests are required prior to treatment. Have blood tests at least two weeks prior to the procedure.
•	If a medication is prescribed, please fill the prescription and take medications as indicated
•	Arrange for transportation to and from the office. You should not drive yourself after the procedure.
•	If you take a blood thinner (baby aspirin, Coumadin, Plavix, etc.) please let us know as this affects your care and postsurgical treatment.
•	No aspirin, ibuprofen or alcohol one week prior to the procedure. Also discontinue all multivitamins, St. John's Wort and Vitamin E.
•	Drink 1-2 quarts of water daily for one week prior to the procedure.
•	Please bathe the day of the procedure.
•	Do not apply any creams or make-up the day of the procedure.
•	Please wear comfortable clothes. If you are normally cold, you may want to wear warm Clothes as our offices are often chilly. A button shirt may be easier for you to remove once you

get home.

Prior to your procedure, you may want to have a light meal.

Posttreatment Instructions for Patients

- Bed rest is helpful after the procedure.
- If medication is prescribed, take the medications as indicated.
- There should be minimal discomfort. Discomfort may be relieved by ice packs or acetaminophen.
- There may be drainage from your incisions. This is normal and may last several days. You may place gauze sponges inside your compression garment to absorb any drainage.
- If a compression garment is recommended, keep absorbent dressing or garment on for 24 hours and then remove. Continue wearing the garment for ______ per physician orders.
- Do not engage in vigorous exercise or sports for at least 2 weeks or until approved by your physician.
- Apply antibiotic ointment or Scarguard treatment to the incision twice daily using a cotton swab.
